



Good afternoon and welcome to All Hallows by the Tower for Sailors' Society's Christmas service.

It's wonderful to gather together once again in the oldest church in the City of London with its befitting maritime history all around us.

While this is a joyous occasion of music, carols and prayer, we of course remember all the men and women working miles away at sea, separated from their loved ones at this special time of year.

For many seafarers and their families, this will be a particularly tough Christmas.

Sailors' Society is supporting several desperate families in India after a crew was thrown in jail in Iran five months ago. They have no idea how long their husbands and fathers will be held, and the seafarers will spend Christmas frightened, alone, out of contact from their loved ones.

While in the Philippines, home to more than 229,000 seafarers, we have been transporting basic food, water and baby milk powder to families whose communities have been destroyed by powerful earthquakes and a super typhoon. Many of their homes have been reduced to rubble and they have had to fight to survive in the devastation and rising flood waters.

This year has marked the 10th anniversary of our Crisis Response Network, which supports seafarers and their families through such traumatic events as piracy attacks, abandonment, false imprisonment, natural disasters and conflict.

On top of this we have launched a new programme called Sea Mate, which trains selected crew members to be Wellness Officers providing support face-to-face on board their vessels.

We ran four Wellness Conferences for cadets, ratings and trainees across the world with more than 9,000 attending and just last month announced a significant expansion of our support for Mandarin-speaking seafarers with the translation of our award-winning wellness resources.

All that we do to support seafarers and their families across the world would not be possible without you, our supporters.

Whether you are a corporate partner or an individual who has followed our work for years, we thank you - and wish you and your families a very happy Christmas and a peaceful and healthy New Year.





Rev'd Nicol Kinrade, Vicar, All Hallows by the Tower

Nicol became Vicar at All Hallows by the Tower in January 2025, and subsequently Rector of St Mary-at-Hill in April. She joined the team from the Diocese of Hereford, where she was the Chaplain to the Bishop of Hereford, and Minor Canon at Hereford Cathedral. Her role with Bishop Richard also included supporting his position in the House of Lords and as Clerk of the Closet (the Head of the Royal Ecclesiastical household). Prior to this she was a parish priest in the Diocese of Chichester, in Sussex. Before ordination Nicol worked in the City of London and subsequently in New York, in the contrasting worlds of museums (including with the Tower of London) and management consulting. She enjoys reading and travelling, and has a particular passion for ocean sailing.

THE CHAPLAIN OF CHAPLAINS – BOET VAN SCHALKWYK



Our pastoral chaplain and Crisis Response Network coordinator, Boet van Schalkwyk, died suddenly following a car accident in March 2025.

Boet began working with the Society in 1989. He was a familiar voice at the end of our helpline and helped found our CRN.

He was an extraordinary man and supported hundreds of seafarers and their families at some of the most difficult times of their lives.

In addition, he was Sailors' Society's chaplain of chaplains, there for all of us who work for the Society.

The news of his death left us reeling, and so many of those who had worked alongside him over the years wanted to share their tributes.

Gavin Lim, our Programme Manager, reflected: "Boet had great passion to serve not only seafarers but also his colleagues. Such compassion serves as a great example for all of us. His spirit and the example he set live on with us."

Johan Smith, our Head of Wellness, said: "Boet saw with love, with care, with empathy and with selflessness. Reflecting on Boet's life, what will stay with me is his ability to see everyone."

Sara Baade, our CEO, added: "Boet leaves behind an extraordinary legacy with all of us. A legacy that inspires us all to be more faithful, compassionate and resilient. Just the way that Boet lived his life."

His heart and dedication to the seafarers he supported were unrivalled, and he was, and will remain, a guide and an inspiration to every single one of us at Sailors' Society.

OUR TEAM IN ACTION

10 years on from the foundation of CRN, a magnitude 6.9 earthquake struck off the coast of northern Cebu Province, devastating its seafaring communities once again.



Homes and roads were destroyed, power supplies failed, and clean water became scarce. And, while the quake was catastrophic for those caught up in it, for their loved ones serving at sea, it was heartbreaking. Calls flooded into our 24/7 helpline and Crisis Response Network as distraught seafarers reached out from vessels around the globe.

We launched an emergency appeal and thanks to long-standing partnerships within the maritime industry, we were able to act fast – coordinating with Stella Maris and local partners to reach affected areas.



On the ground, Programme Manager Gavin Lim said: "Families were sheltering under tarplins, desperate for the food, water and baby formula we were bringing them."

As well as helping the families, our team was able to reassure crew at sea and give them much-needed updates.

Within weeks, the same families found their makeshift shelters battered by Super Typhoon Fung-Wong, one of the most powerful storms to hit the Philippines this year.

Thankfully, we were still able to help, not just with immediate supplies and emergency grants, but also with long-term trauma counselling supporting those who are trying to pick up their lives amidst the debris and desolation.

Sailors' Society is here for seafarers, whether they are facing a crisis or just need someone to talk to.

Our support is 24/7, our helpline response is immediate, and female crew can speak to another female if they wish. Our crisis support is second to none and offers long-term support. And our unique Peer-to-Peer Support Groups provide confidential spaces that are used by thousands of seafarers and their families.

But none of this is possible without your continued support. We rely completely on funders and donors to be here 24/7 for our seafaring community.

For 10 years, our crisis team has stood side by side with those who face the most terrifying moments at sea.

With an unwavering commitment, for the past decade, our Crisis Response Network has been a beacon of hope, offering vital free 24/7 care and support to those who face unimaginable challenges, such as piracy, imprisonment, shipwrecks and abandonment.

Our global network of crisis responders has helped seafarers navigate their darkest hours.

Here are just some of the seafarers and families we have helped over the past 10 years.



Imprisonment

The ship Seaman Guard, engaged in an anti-piracy operation, was running low on fuel. It stopped in Indian waters to refuel, unaware that the fuel was stolen.

The 35-strong crew were given a five year prison sentence. Sailors' Society was on hand to offer support on a daily basis.



Piracy

In October 2016, the survivors of the Taiwan-owned fishing vessel, Naham 3, were finally released after being held for almost five years by Somali pirates. Sailors' Society's CRN team was on hand to help.

Some 28 of the crew had been taken hostage. The pirates killed the Captain.

Bereavement trauma

In July 2017, the fishing vessel, the Maredon, on her maiden voyage, capsized off the Eastern Cape of Africa. The 16 man crew, trapped under their upturned boat, were terrified.

Our CRN team stepped in to give trauma and grief counselling to the survivors and families of all the crew members.



“The pirates were shouting ‘Where’s the Captain?’ and shooting the floor. They did not know that he was already dead in the engine room. I felt desperate and terrified.”

“The crew could barely perform their duties on board - they were crying, did not eat well, slept together in the corridors out of fear, suffered panic attacks, woke up at any noise and had constant nightmares.”



Shipwreck

In February 2022, the crew of the Tresta Star was bunkering (taking on diesel fuel) in mid Indian Ocean when Cyclone Batsirai hit.

SOS flares were fired off and while they waited to be rescued in the dark amid a rising storm surge, Sailors' Society's CRN team was called.

False imprisonment

The CRN team was contacted in August 2022.

A crew of 16 Indians, eight Sri Lankans, one Polish and one Filipino national, had been detained by Nigerian authorities, accused of attempted oil theft and faking a piracy attack.

The crew were finally released, and we helped repatriate them back to their families in June 2023.



War

In July 2024, the crew of an oil tanker huddled together in corridors, too terrified to sleep in their cabins after coming under attack from Houthi rebels in the Red Sea.

Panic-stricken and traumatised, one crew member reached out to Sailors' Society's CRN team.


